OVER EVOLVING VISION

MAHAVIR INTERNATIONAL DELHI

'तमसो माँ ज्योतिर्गमय'

hough Mahavir International Delhi (MID) by its character is a "non-religious society", this is more a statement intended to define that we do not identify with any one religion but instead follow the core tenets of all religions. I say this because wherever work is done to help uplift the less fortunate, that too with the spirit of universal compassion, it can only be defined as God's work.

In the backdrop of the above, on being asked to write about our vision for the future of MID, the only thought coming to mind is - 'तमसो माँ ज्योतिर्गमय' or a clarion call for humanity to move "From Darkness to Light", which is the essence of scriptures cutting across all religions. However while in the spiritual sense this essentially means removing the darkness of ignorance with the knowledge of light, for MID this additionally means removing the darkness of deprivation with the light of compassionate service and darkness of vision by the light of timely Eye Care/increased Eye Donations. More on the vision a bit later, first let us assess the present.

NEW INITIATIVES

As extremely fulfilling two year tenure of the current Board draws to a close, we all can indeed look back with satisfaction on the various little milestones achieved. I purposely use the term "little" here as when we are doing God's work, we cannot afford to be haughty. Our efforts are but a drop in the ocean of service being rendered by the Cosmos at large. For the purpose of brevity and also to avoid repetition, I will not dwell on all of our achievements and instead focus on initiatives of the current year.

- बीमारी से आजादी As the country embarked on the 75th year of independence, MID also took upon itself the onus of doing its bit to liberate section of our populace from the spectre of diseases. And we did it by increasing the number of camps under our flagship programme of "Doctor at doorstep". In the first seven months an unprecedented 150 camps have been organised either directly or through our affiliates on a Pan India basis, resulting in nearly 60,000 OPD consultations/treatment for our beneficiaries. Other than quantity, even the quality of the interventions has been paid attention to. MID, for the first time organised a structured interaction with the Doctors attending the camps to get their suggestions on how we can enhance the effectiveness of healthcare during the camp. Suggestions given by them are being acted upon. Additionally, we are also planning to televise in the camps a brief film on the importance of primary health care – including healthy lifestyle, diet etc.
 - A heartfelt thanks to all our CPSE, Corporate and individual donors for financing these initiatives and giving MID the opportunity to conduct so many camps.
- झांके नन्हीं आंखों में Those of us who have had the privilege of attending public schools will remember the periodic medical checks that used to be conducted – where among other assessments, our vision used to be checked. I distinctly remember getting detected with Myopia as a seven year old. The timely detection and correction using spectacles not only helped me see the blackboard better but also arrested any increase of myopia. However even five decades hence, a significant section of our child population is not privileged with such checkup at schools. And this can result in not only shortsightedness, but also its causes like childhood diabetes, going undetected.

The above situation got us thinking and resulted in birth of झांके नन्हीं आंखों में – an initiative taking us to municipal/NGO run schools, who are primarily educating the underprivileged children, to get their vision and basic medical checks carried out. The spectacles for the children detected with Myopia are delivered to the schools a couple of days later. Students are also being administered basic deworming medicines in these camps. Additionally these camps also carry out the vision test of the parents and other service providers in the school, so that the benefits can reach many!



A popular intervention, since its launch in July this year, already 10camps have been held wherein close to 3000 children have been administered the check and 166 have benefited from timely vision correction by way of provision of spectacles.

3.) Healthcare Training – MID also made a new and much needed foray this year. The importance of informal health care cannot be lost as our country ages rapidly. Increased life expectancy and nuclear families means increasedrequirement of paramedic attention. Hence MID has got into Nursing Assistant training at our Nabi Karim centre collaborating with SSS Foundation, who have already conducted this course in Bavana. At the time of writing two batches are in progress educating 25 young women on the nuances of health care. Theoretical classes are accompanied by visits to the various facilities at the centre so that the students gain practical knowledge as well. The students will be certified by Apollo Mediskills, and hence enter the job market confidently.

Through this initiative, we hope to provide gainful employment to the youth around Nabi Karim on one hand and also help reduce the paucity of competent health care service providers on the other.

Now I dwell on the **Vision** of MID. Well, it is simple, we continue our endeavour of dispelling darkness of the distressed both by way of our health care interventions pivoted on eye care and also by the light of knowledge – be it creating awareness on primary healthcare and vocational training to the underprivileged. Close to 70,000 consultations/therapies/tests in the first seven months of this year and performance of more than 650 cataract surgeries shows that our healthcare interventions are once again on the growth path after the hiatus suffered due to pandemic and its induced lockdowns.

Reach out for Eye Pledge to the living and consent for Eye Donations by the near and dear of those who have passed on, is another key area, that MID hopes to work upon more intensely in the coming years. In fact the second is what finally results in the availability of the two corneas and also what one can ensure while living. Hence motivation for this act assumes as much importance as eliciting pledges.

As all light has a source, so too for MID the source for our interventions is manpower and funding. On the first, we are endeavouring to put in place a lean but intelligent workforce, who can couple the ground level efforts with smart digital interventions to be more effective. Continuous evaluation of their performance and periodic mentoring is also being undertaken. On the issue of funds, however there is a need for a rethink. MID has till now adopted the policy of pricing our services at a bare minimum and making up for the deficit through the liberal contributions we receive in our fund raisers. However this may not always prove sustainable as the donors too can be afflicted by limitations off and on – especially as the COVID period has shown. Also even at the best of times it does not help add to the Corpus of the Society, which even after 44 years of existence hovers around a modest Rs One Crore for MID.

There is therefore a need to rationalize the pricing of our services and also increase utilization of our space and facilities to enhance accruals. Our centres are without doubt "Not for Profit". However, they should also be "Not for Loss" to the extent possible. A workable and self-financing arrangement is necessary at all the centres, for the services to remain sustainable, even if it means a modest hike in the charges. As regards improved level of infrastructure utilization – a start has already been made with the outsourcing of physiotherapy services at Hauz Rani, which has helped MID cut down all loses in this intervention. The pathological services are also being considered for a similar model change. Needless to mention the reach out to our CPSE, Corporate and individual donors will continue and get augmented by a more focused social media outreach – which is fast becoming the source for significant donations.

To conclude, MID hopes to build up on its strong fundamentals created by the compassionate toil of many of our early luminaries adopting new methods of interventions to help dispel darkness from society to the extent we can. As conveyed at the start, our work is at the behest of the Almighty and as long as we do it with a spirit of service and love, He will surely take care and ensure fruition of our noble vision and mission to dispel darkness - तमसो माँ ज्योतिर्गमय!



SECRETARY REPORT

Jai Mahavir

Mahavir International is celebrating Eye Care Day on 19th Nov 2022 after successfully coming out from the two struggling year 2020-2022 which were the most horrified years for the whole world losing near and dear ones due to covid 19, but we did not stop doing our best to serve the society during pandemic. Looking behind on our achievements, it gives us immense satisfaction, to be able to bring

smiles on the gloomy faces of the large populace of disadvantaged section of society. In spite of so many hurdles and pandemic, this year ended on 31st March 2022 was eventful as always.

Performance of Mahavir International Delhi Centre during the year 2021-2022 is as follows:

Other than our regular activity of providing healthcare services at our 3 Medical Centre and camps, three new projects were launched. During the period of first quarter when there was shortage of oxygen, Project "हर सांस है जरूरी" was launched by arranging 257 OXYGEN CONCENTRATORS and distributing to other centres of Mahavir International on Pan India basis, Government and Private Hospitals. Total cost of this project was Rs. 245.35 lacs which was sponsored by CONCOR, NSFDC, Vandana Jain and Raj Jain from USA, Private Coperates and Individuals. Other than the oxygen concentrators, 3 ICU Ventilators were also provided to the different hospitals.



On 18th July 2021 MID celebrated its Foundation Day-2021 by launch of COVID VACCINATION drive by starting free Vaccination centre at Nabi Karim Hospital. After successful working at Nabi Karim another vaccination centre was inaugurated at Badarpur Hospital on 16th Aug 2021. The vaccination drive was supported by various PSEs namely CONCOR, NSKFDC, NMDFC and other corporates and individuals. Total 16950persons were benefited under this project which had a cost of Rs. 168.60 lacs.

During the period ''सबको भोजन'' was also initiated to provide meal to around 250 daily wagers on rotation basis outside our three hospitals at Nabi Karim, Hauz Rani and Badarpur.

During the year we have signed Memorandum of Understanding with PSUs like CONCOR, RITES, GAIL, National Backward Classes Financial Development Corporation (NBCFDC), National Minorities Development Finance Corporation (NMDFC), National handicapped Finance and Development Corporation (NHFDC) and Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India for organizing health Check-up camps under Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative. Other corporate Houses and individuals like Rajdhani Besan Group, Safexpress, Vibes Health Care Ltd., Sh. Raj & Smt. Vandana Jain of USA are regular sponsors of the camps.

I thank all the donors, sponsors and philanthropists for their continued patronage.

In spite of all odds MID organized 133 camps during the year out of which 86 camps were organized in Delhi-NCR and remaining 47 camps were organized outstation. Out station camps were organised at Chittogarh, Baran & Sirohi etc. with the support of local centres of Mahavir International and other local philanthropists. With the unstinted, unconditional, continuous, dedicated and active support of local centres of MI, we have been able to do this task with ease and maintaining high level of quality. I express my heartfelt thanks herculean gratitude to the entire team of local centres from the bottom of my heart.

Three Board Meetings were held during the year 2021-22

After 2018, in the year 2021 physical Eye Care Day- HOPE FOR LIGHT was organized on the evening of Sunday 28th Nov 2021 at the Stein Auditorium, India Habitat Centre, New Delhi with a live concert by renowned singer Padamjeet Sehrawat, performance by children and youth of allied NGOs namely Godhuli, Jamghat and Housla and hidden talent of MID Pariwar.

An initiative of EMPLOYEES RECOGNITION on monthly basis was launched to motivate employees and teams to work at their full potential.

I express my thanks and gratitude from the bottom of my heart to the Chairman, Board members, my colleagues and others for their continuous guidance and support in fulfilling my responsibilities as secretary.

I also thank the team of more than 100 Doctors, medical & para-medical staff, administrative staff and associated agencies and suppliers who have been working tirelessly in achieving our mission "LOVE ALL- SERVE ALL" and "CATARACT FREE DELHI" and hope that their support will continue to be forthcoming in the years to come.

To further its service & reach, the Organization conducts a large number of Eye & Health checkup camps Pan-India & runs 4 fully equipped Mobile Medicare vans under their flagship "Doctor at Doorstep" project in far flung areas & JJ clusters in and around the National Capital egion of Delhi.

So, although the focus of Mahavir International Delhi continues to remain on Eye care, the organization is always at the forefront whenever there is a burning issue to be handled. MID has stood firm and tall and its members have contributed in a big way towards rehabilitation programmes whenever a calamity has hit our Country or its neighbours in the past.

MID HEALTH CENTRES AT A GLANCE

Rajdhani Charitable Eye and Medical Centre is situated at backward & thickly populated area of Nabi Karim, Qutab Road. It was set up in Nov. 1998 with 10 Beds & facility of Cataract surgery dedicated at the hands of Sh. Vijay Kapoor Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Delhi. It was converted to full-fledged hospital with the inauguration of other facilities by Smt. Sheila Dikshit Former Chief Minister of Delhi in October 1999. It has OPD facilities in Eyes, General Medicine, Homeopathy, Physiotherapy, Digital Pathology Laboratory, and State of the Art Operation Theater for Cataract Surgeries.

Lala Aman Singh Jain Charitable Eye Research and Medical Centre at the backward area in Hauz Rani Market near Saket in South Delhi was inaugurated by the Dr. Ashok Walia on 10.2.2002, the then Health Minister of Delhi. In January 2012, this hospital has been upgraded with Ultra Modern State-of-the-Art operation theatre. It has OPD facilities in Eyes, General Medicine, Gynecology, Homeopathy, Ayurveda, Physiotherapy and State of the Art Operation Theater for Cataract Surgeries.

Kishwarna Charitable Eye & Medical Centre at Badarpur well equipped with Modern Art Operation Theatre for Cataract surgeries donated by Late Shri Krishan Lal Arora of Kishwarna Charitable Trust was inaugurated on 29th January 2006. It has OPD facilities in Eyes, General Medicine, ENT, Gynecology, Homeopathy, Ayurveda and Physiotherapy.

MAJOR PROGRAMES

Eye Care

Mahavir International is committed to provide quality eye care to the needy underprivileged people of Delhi without any caste or religious bias. dream & vision of making Delhi a 'Cataract Free Zone'.

The organization has also been part of various Delhi govt. programmes over the years, for eye screening & check-ups of students, pensioners, Tihar Jail inmates among others.

Till date, over 30,000 cataract surgeries with IOL implants and eye sight of over 566 persons restored through eye donations and 5 cornea transplants and over 52 lakh patients have received treatment.

We are also associated with Delhi Government for its project, "MOTIA BIND MUKTI ABHIYAAN".

HEALTH CARE SERVICES

In addition to providing medical services at the three Health Centres detailed above, we are also organizing Free Eye & Medical check-up camps Pan-India and running four Mobile Medicare units to provide free medical facilities & distribute free medicines to poor residents of far-flung areas & JJ clusters at their doorsteps and two vans for pick and drop of patients.

EYE PLEDGES AND DONATIONS

Moving another step closer to realizing its dream of providing 'Sight to all', Mahavir International Delhi had launched yet another initiative, Eye Donation Pledges and mobilized a host of people from all walks of life including prominent personalities and Renowned singers like Kailash Kher, Shaan, Shankar Mahadevan, Ghazal Maestro Late Jagjit Singh, Hindi Poet Sh. Ashok Chakradhar, and Late Raju Srivastava Comedy King have pledged their eyes so far.

Over 34,100 persons have pledged their eyes so far. Actual eye donations from 283 persons after death have provided sight to 566 blind people.

DOCTOR-AT-DOORSTEP

It has been a mission of Mahavir International Delhi to provide medical support to the maximum number of needy people. Towards this end, the organization has taken up an ambitious project aptly named "Doctor at Door Step". Under this program, 4 fully equipped Mobile Vans complete with all medical facilities are deputed with a team of doctors and paramedical staff to provide treatment and two vans for pick and drop of patients. This is a unique and innovative initiative by the organization to fulfil the goals set by it.

OUTSTATION CAMPS

Mahavir International is also organizing outstation Eye & Health checkup camps pan-India for PSEs & Corporates at their local hubs in association with local chapters of Mahavir International APEX.

VIRA VISION GROUP

Moved by the condition of the patients visiting our Health Centres, the women at MID decided to do their bit by actively supporting the members at MID. Not to be left behind, they formed a group calling themselves the Vira Vision Group. (Men and Women of Mahavir International are known as Virs and Viras). Their aim is to provide relief to the poor and distressed members of society at a grassroots level. Towards this end their activities include facilitation of hygiene and sanitation, supporting development, and covering up deficiencies.

This group is the pride of Mahavir International Delhi.



COVID-19 came upon our nation as a challenge. MID rose to the occasion and provided Relief Support in several areas:

DURING THE FIRST WAVE

More than 1.53 lacs Food Packets, 34,300 Face Masks, 29,430 Sanitary pads, 15,000 water bottles, 4400 soaps, 3300 Ration Bags, 4300 Blankets, 700 Face Shields, 150 PPE Kits, 2650 Baby Kits, 300 packets of Stationery items besides Utensils/Gas Stove have been distributed costing more than Rs. 1 Crore. Additionally, we distributed 1000 diapers for Alzheimer patients; clothes to a similar number and four months complete ration toold-age homes.

All this was realized and made possible through the Vision and support provided by the team led by MID's **Vira Vision Group**.

During the Second Wave

- More than 305 Oxygen Concentrators at a cost of Rs. 3.50 Crores have been provided to Govt. Hospitals and Charitable hospitals for the treatment of COVID patients.
- So far more than 9500 persons have been vaccinated through camps and in our Two Private Covid Vaccination Centres. The approx amount that will be spent is more than Rs. 1.03 Crore.
 - So far more than **25000 food packets** have been distributed to Daily Wagers, Rickshaw Pullers, Construction labourers etc. towards which we have approximately spent more than **Rs. 9 lacs**.

Post COVID

With COVID firmly behind us, MID set out this year to address the health issues of the economically weaker section of our society who had been additionally deprived of healthcare because of COVID restrictions. Some new initiatives were launched.

MID launched another new project "झांके नन्हीं आंखों में" for providing free Eye Check up and provision of distance vision glasses to children detected with eye sight problems by organizing free camps. The importance of timely detection and correction by using spectacles helps children see the blackboard and thereby understand the lesson being taught and also arrest the increase of myopia.

So far we have organized 9 camps and attended to more than 2500 children.

Health Care Training

MID also made a new and much needed foray this year. The importance of informal health care cannot be lost as our country ages rapidly. Increased life expectancy and nuclear families means increased requirement of paramedic attention.

The Nabi Karim centre has now commenced health care training for Nursing Assistants by collaborating with SSS Foundation. Till date more than 25 young women students have been enrolled and are being trained on the nuances of health care. The students will be certified by Apollo Mediskills in due course.

Through this initiative, MID hopes to provide gainful employment to the youth around Nabi Karim on one hand and also help reduce the paucity of competent health care service providers on the other.

'बीमारी से आजादी' - As the country embarked on the 75th year of independence, MID also took upon itself the onus of doing its bit to liberate section of our populace from the spectre of diseases. And we did it by

- 1) increasing the number of camps under our flagship programme of "Doctor at doorstep". In the first seven months an unprecedented 150 camps have been organized either directly or through our affiliates on a Pan India basis, resulting in nearly 62660 OPD consultations/treatment for our beneficiaries. Other than quantity, even the quality of the interventions has been paid attention to. MID, for the first time,organised a structured interaction with the Doctors attending the camps to get their suggestions on how we can enhance the effectiveness of healthcare during the camp. Suggestions given by them are being acted upon. Additionally, we are also planning to televise in the camps a brief film on the importance of primary health care including healthy lifestyle, diet etc.
- 2) organizing free OPD from time to time at our 3 Centres. Free OPD entails a patient to free registration and free medicines. This also helped to increased footfalls at the Centres on these days.

In Summary,

Since 1998 nearly 52 lakh patients have benefited from our health care and related services. We have organized more than 3,220 free Eye & Health check-up camps under our Doctor at Doorstep initiative and performed close to 30,000 cataract operations. Significantly we have also been able to motivate 283 families to donate eyes of their deceased member thereby facilitating 566 blind persons to see and enjoy the beauty of this wonderful world.



VIRA VISION A Champion of Compassionate Service to the Society

As all of us know, the past two years 2020-21 and 2021-22 have been indeed one of the darkest period in our lives, with pain of a deadly disease, losses of near and dear ones as also of livelihood. The only reason of cheer was the human spirit and brotherhood, which helped us overcome adversity. The years have shown, that life is fickle and that humans need to practice loving and giving. And Vira Vision, the women's wing of Mahavir International Delhi (MID) has lived upto this principle!

The organization has in the past two years mobilized and deployed a whopping Rs 85 lakhs for benefiting those in distress – especially the underprivileged and lit a smile in many forlorn faces. While a detailed break-up of the contributions of Vira Vision are enclosed, some of the major highlights are briefed herein below:

- With the livelihood of lakhs of migrant labour and daily wagers affected in the various lockdown, Vira Vision mobilised from members, donors and corporates close to Rs 45 lakhs which were used to feed nearly 1, 85,000 meals to slum dwellers, daily wagers, migrant workers as also the elderly and the mentally challenged.
- Close to Rs 25 lakhs was utilized for giving basic ration kits to 2,200 families along with other essentials such as soaps, toiletries, slippers, jackets and other such daily essential items for the poor.
- Given its commitment to Women and child care, Vira Vision members continued to visit hospitals and slums, unmindful of the risks associated with the pandemic and distributed around Rs. 5 lakhs worth of sanitary pads, baby kits, diapers, baby woollens etc thereby assuring these vulnerable category that they were being cared for. It also participated in the country wide record setting endeavour for distribution of 2,500 baby kits and played its part in distributing 300 kits in Safdarjung Hospital, Clothes to families at Shikharji, Bihar & Special meals to 1550 Alzheimer patients of Guru Vishram Vridh Ashram and 75 mentally retarded children of Nirmal Jyoti Foundation
- Last but not the least, Vira Vision also participated in addressing health care challenges by liberally distributing PPE kits, face masks, shields etc to the exposed health care worker. Later the organization also helped MID vaccinate the under privileged in the charitable hospitals run by the centre by sponsoring 300 jabs. Eight cataract correction surgeries were also sponsored.

Vira Vision continues to play the role of a proactive advisor of MID. The new initiative of MID – 'झांके नहीं आंखों में', which entails carrying out eye and basic health check of underprivileged children in their schools coupled with distribution of Distance Vision spectacles to correct Short sightedness, was also a brainchild of Vira Vision. In a short period of four months nearly 3000 children of 10 schools have benefitted from this endeavour.

Vira Vision hopes to carry out such field level activities with compassion in future also so that MID's objective of **"LOVE ALL SERVE ALL"** gets fulfilled in the truest sense.





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




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Arthritis

How To Prevent and Manage



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LIFE IS MOTION, MOTION IS LIFE

uman body is a sophisticated machine designed by God which has many moving parts joined to each other through joints.

Like any other mechanical machine, these joints also have wear and tear with time and lead to age related arthritis called osteoarthritis.

Bones forming the joints are actually covered with very fine, almost frictionless joint cartilage, which allows us infinite, painless movement years after years. But when this wears out with time underlying bone is exposed, there are inflammatory reactions in the joints. Joints then become painful and person may have difficulty in walking or may have pain even at rest.

Where as age related osteoarthritis develops very slowly, there is another type of arthritis which can develop very rapidly and it is called "inflammatory type of arthritis" for example rheumatoid arthritis. I call this a "red flag arthritis" because if it is not diagnosed early and special disease modifying drugs not given in time, not only many joints can get destroyed in the body but also this disease can affect many other organs.

Like any other disease which it is obviously preferable to prevent or delay the onset of degeneration of joints and ensuing osteoarthritis as much as possible.

Keeping weight in check, strengthening muscles around the joints, doing stretching and flexibility exercises go a long way in keeping the joints healthy and pain-free. In early part of the disease, pain can be managed by above measures and simple pain killers and sometimes drugs which are likely to enhance the

cartilage health for Inflammatory type of arthritis specific disease modifying drugs under medical supervision are extremely important.

However, in spite of all the measures arthritis can progress with time and lead to severe changes and end-stage arthritis, both by age related osteoarthritis and inflammatory type of arthritis. For end-stage arthritis, now it is possible to replace the joint for most of the major joints and also small joints of fingers.

With advances in metallurgy and understanding in the biomechanics of joints modern joint replacements are very sophisticated and almost mimic natural joints.

Computer assistance has added another great dimension to joint replacement and helps in precise placement of the artificial joint, there by increasing its efficiency and expected longevity.

In the case of Knee Joint, many a time, only part of the joint is affected by arthritis and it is now possible to change only the affected part by doing partial knee arthroplasty rather than changing the whole joint. This obviously has less chances of complications, causes less stress of surgery on the patient and gives much better function

Joint replacement has come as a boon for patients who were crippled with pain and could not mobilize without significant pain. After Joint replacement, such patients are able to walk pain-free for long distances. This not only increases their mobility but also helps in preventing other diseases which require walking exercises such as diabetes, blood pressure etc. Also pain free and limp free mobility brings self-esteem back in hitherto crippled patients.



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o believe that Heart disease occurs only after the fourth or fifth decade would be erroneous. I do concede that it gets the maximum prominence at that time largely because it affects the most productive set of our population and that too at their career peaks. But the truth is that Heart Disease really affects the entire spectrum of the population from the unborn to the Super Seniors!













HEART DISEASE IN CHILDREN

In infancy and childhood, we come across Congenital Heart Defects in about 8 out of every thousand live births. Some babies that are born blue because of Birth defects of the heart have to be operated in infancy itself and this highly specialised branch of medicine is not given adequate importance the world over and humanity carries the guilt of letting some of these children grow to adolescence when secondary changes in the lung make them inoperable. As Pediatric Cardiac surgery is expensive due to requirement of sophisticated infra structure and specially trained professionals it is not universally developed in the private Healthcare sector.

The young parents at the first rungs of their Careers do not have the necessary resource to afford the hospital bills. To assist in this area, Rotary International (a world wide NGO) has come forward to fund / defray the cost of the hospitalisations by their "GIFT OF LIFE" mission.

ROTARY G.O.L. OUTREACH Mission is to screen school children and pick up kids who may be having a heart defect! Unknowingly, since many children with Heart Defects, or their parents do not notice any symptoms during the time that they can be operated, they end up in an inoperable situation because of irreversible change in their lungs. Also many other philanthropic organizations also pitch in to offer succour to these unlucky kids born to poor parents. The Government does give importance to this speciality in their premier tertiary care centres but only to a few. The vast majority in non urban areas may remain unattended because of ignorance or lack of resources.

HEART DISEASE IN ADOLESCENTS

Heart disease affects school children as well as many neglect repeated sore Throats and joint pains and end up with heart valve narrowed or leaking. Government run schemes like AYUSHMAN BHARAT and Arogyashree do fund these children for ballooning and artificial heart valves. India probably does the







maximum number of valve related procedures in the World. So far only one Artifical Valve was manufactured in India called "Chitra Valve", but recently some other Indian Organisations also have been encouraged to make valves by PM Modi's "Make in India" Mission.

HEART DISEASE AT PEAK OF LIFE!



Thanks to our Genetic predilection and food habits, Heart disease continues to be the biggest killer of Indian adults. As the Festival season begins, the consumption of sweets go up and so does our incidence of Diabetes. Today it is not the cholesterol that we consume directly affects the heart but it is the carbohydrates that get converted to body fat and consequent Insulin Resistance. Lack of exercise, smoking and stressful life are the curse of the competitive age that we live in. Getting into the stage of angina before starting preventive measures is a no brainer.

What we should aim is to prevent deposition of fats on the walls of our coronary or cerebral arteries which may progress to various degrees of narrowing. Going to the Doctor only after symptoms are noticed is the present practice.

Today the approach towards the Predator Heart disease is to be PROACTIVE rather than the REACTIVE approach of the past! Regular monitoring of Blood sugar and cholesterol are a must for all persons beyond

45 years. HbA1c and Lipid profiles are mandatory even for asymptomatic successful people.

Recently in addition to CT scan and Angiography which pick up the narrowing of the arteries at the late stages, Artificial Intelligence aided CT scans and MRI's become valuable in discovering early disease and institute appropriate treatment using nutraceuticals in a preventive role much before the disease manifests in heart attacks or Sudden deaths. Lot of research is also being done in the use of growth hormones, testosterone and exosomes to prevent atherosclerosis which is the

hitherto inevitable cause of ageing.

Persons suspected of having Heart disease need to be subjected to Angiography and Revascularization if needed. Deciding on the modality of Revascularization should be the exclusive decision of the Doctor and not dictated by patient preference. Though stents are getting better and better, Bypass Surgery with arterial grafts are more durable and saves more lives in the long run.

In the super seniors, we encounter problems of degeneration and rhythm disturbances. For fit patients surgical replacement of calcified valves is the treatment offered but for the unfit seniors, a less invasive but more expensive transcatheter valve or TAVI is getting popular.

Advancement in Pacemakers and Defibrillators have also contributed in a big way to increase Longevity.

Article about Anaesthesia.

eally!!! the human brain is so complex that despite research for so many years the mechanism that actually allows the brain to switch off completely for a few hrs or even days and then come back to full consciousness, is not easily explained. But, we the anaesthetists or anesthesiologists, as we are addressed in the USA, do this, day in and day out, a number of times.


Why and how do we do this?

Why is easy to explain...For any successful procedure to be performed in the body, by any doctor, the body needs to be immobile, steady and relaxed, so that the intricate procedures can happen. Also, as human beings are sensitive to pain and react by verbal (shouting), physical (hit back) and in a controlled manner by tightening up..all three are injurious to the patient or the doctor. So putting them to sleep, make them unconscious, so they don't feel anything and paralyze them, so they don't move, is important. for the sake of the patient, his treatment and for the doctor.

How do we do that?

Scientists, experimenting with many a substances, found out that some gases, when inhaled, makes one feel happy (like the laughing gas, N2O), or ether which made one sleepy and insensitive to pain, the juices from the poppy seeds, made one intoxicated with happy feelings and pain-free, alcohol consumption made one forget physical misery. In 1846, 16th October, the first public demonstration happened when a man inhaled a vapor and was subjected to an operation, without pain and he woke up, as if from sleep and felt nothing...

Thus happened the birth of a new branch in medical science, called anaesthesia. Though it is considered the youngest branch, today it is the most sought out branch. Present day anaesthetic drugs are made in labs which have ability to sedate patients, keep them pain-free and immobile. They are relatively safe and easy to use and anaesthetists are well trained to use them and in the process of learning to become one, they also become good intensitivists and pain therapists.





Angesthesia could be

A. General: when the whole body is insensitive to surgery and mind sleeping or switched off.,

B. Regional: when a part of the body having the surgery is blocked from being sensitive. Here, the subject is often awake and can be listening to music or watching his own surgery on the monitor or snoozing.

C. Local: where a small area is blocked with an injection (often given by the surgeon himself) and procedures performed.

An anaesthetist is fully qualified medical doctor, who is a physician, as he/she has to understand the patient along with his/her medical problems, know the medications taken by the patient and their side effects, their reactions to anaesthetic drugs, know a bit of all branches of surgery to provide the best condition

for surgeon to work, know a lot of physics, to understand the various machines used to deliver the anaesthesia gases and drugs, electrical and electronic knowledge to understand the equipment used to monitor the patients,

equipments used by surgical team for cutting, burning the tissues and how to handle their effects on the human body. A thorough knowledge of all the drugs anyone uses, knowledge about blood and blood products, when to give, what to give to the anaesthetised patient undergoing operation.

A good knowledge of the body physiology and maintenance of pulse, blood pressure, urine output and other parameters of the patient.

As they make the patient insensitive to pain, and temperature, hunger and thirst, and other body functions, it becomes their responsibility to maintain the fluid balance, the sugar levels, the body temperature, physical comforts of the anaesthetised patients, making sure the body is well protected, too during the course of the operation.

Apart from these, reassuring patients and relatives before the surgery, making them comfortable, when they would be anxious and upset for the necessity of a procedure. Looking after people, who undergo procedures under regional and local blocks, while being awake, is itself an art.

Anaesthetists, by virtue of their profession are the most forgotten doctors, who don't even often get thanked by the patients, (as the latter due to the effects of drugs, have some memory loss) where as the surgeon gets to be treated as a' hero' who saved their life.

Still, Why do we love our profession...then?? being woken up at odd hours for caesarians, running to emergencies, to resuscitate patients sustaing major traumas.

Is it the power to wave the "magic wand" and put someone to sleep and wake up..??

Is it to hear the person wake up

and says "is it over, I didn't feel a thing"??

Is it because, even the senior most doctors give way to the anaesthetist to do the needful in an emergency situation??

yes it is all that...and many more satisfying moments.

Honestly, it gives me a reason to thank God, everytime I wake up a patient, unharmed by my anaesthesia or the surgeon's knife.the feeling of gratitude, an exhilaration, when a very sick one gets out safely, makes my day.

On the happy note, I always say, we all put people to sleep, for free (anyone can do that with a hammer) but charge only for waking one up.





Social Media Do's and Don'ts





Today, use of digital media has become ubiquitous for education, social contacts, and entertainment. Adolescents are the prime users of digital media including social media. Children and adolescents who use social media may experience both positive and negative psychological outcomes.

- Social connectedness is important for psychosocial development in terms of sense of belonging, psychosocial well being, and identity development and processes. Social media plays an important role in social connectedness. Social media also helps in enhancing knowledge and expression, exchange of resources, and information.
- Social media may also be harmful as it leads to problematic media/Internet use, reduced time for other activities, and potential for cyberbullying and other harms. Studies have demonstrated that low use (<1 hour per day) of social media is more beneficial than no use. However, moderate-to-heavy use (>2 hours per day) is harmful in various ways including for suicidal thoughts and plans.

Social media sites are extremely popular. While most adolescents use WhatsApp and Facebook, many are also on Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, and others. We, the pediatricians, should be able to help and guide the adolescents and their parents in safe use of social media and other digital media to aid adolescent health and development.

Benefits of Social Media

- ☑ It helps children to keep in touch with distant family members and friends.
- ✓ Students can work together on projects.
- It helps adolescents with conditions such as obesity, chronic illnesses such as diabetes mellitus or depression, chronic disabilities, or rare diseases, to network with each other.
- It fosters social inclusion among adolescents who feel excluded, such as those identifying as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and intersex (LGBTQI).
- ☑ It aids in the spread of information, innovations, and ideas.
- ✓ It creates opportunities for community activism.

Standard Treatment Guidelines

- ☑ It decreases physical activity and contributes to the development of overweight and obesity.
- Sleep problems, including disturbed sleep and sleep deficit due to delay in going to bed or difficulty in falling sleep.
- Social media addiction, resulting in inadequate time for sleep, study, physical activity, and real-time socialization.
- ☑ Exposure to ads promoting the use of alcohol, tobacco, and drugs.
- ☑ Exposure to sites promoting sexual license and disordered eating habits.



- ☑ Low feeling brought on by persistent viewing of online posts, which give the impression that everyone else than you are always successful and enjoying pleasurable experiences.
- ☑ Risk of cybercrime, including cyberbullying, sexting, and online grooming for child abuse.
- ☑ **Loss of privacy :** Information once shared on a post may spread easily to unintended recipients and may be impossible to remove.

✓ Limit screen use:

- Screen time for entertainment should be restricted. Parents should negotiate with adolescents
 to keep it minimum. Help the parents construct a Family Media Use Plan, making a daily 24hour timetable for each adolescent that includes school time and homework, 8–12 hours for
 sleep, 1 hour for physical activity, and time for family, friends, and relaxation.
- No use of media while studying or at meals.

✓ No secretive online activity:

- The computer should be used in a public area; no devices in the bedroom.
- No device use from an hour before bedtime.
- Discuss and decide the utility and restricted use of smartphones for school-going children with monitoring the use of it.

☑ Monitor their online activity:

- Before 10 years:
 - Do not permit the use of social media at all before 10 years, except for video chatting with relatives.

☑ Early-to-middle adolescence:

- Discourage the use of social media except for educational, sports, and extracurricular assignments. Check their online history regularly.
- Talk to them daily about the sites they visited, whether they chatted with anyone, whether they
 made any post on social media.
- Monitor their email for offensive content.
- Discuss your own online practices with them.

✓ Late adolescence:

- They demand, and need, more privacy.
- Try to ask them daily about their social media use, but do not expect the whole truth.
- Do ask if he/she felt uncomfortable with a message or post by any known or unknown person.

☑ Visit them online on social media sites:

- Familiarize yourself with the social media site and confirm that it is appropriate for them. Discuss these with them and warn them of potential harms.
- Join them on the site and compulsorily "friend" them.
- Teach them how to use the privacy features of the site.

☑ Teach them the safety rules:

- Beware of strangers:
 - Use social media sites only for strengthening friendships, not for making new virtual friends.
 - Chat online only with those you know personally.
 - Never exchange photos with strangers.
 - Never give out personal information to a stranger, not even name, age, address, phone number, date of birth, personal interests, name of the school, or friends' names.
 - Do not meet in person someone whom you only know online. If you wish to meet an online friend, meet the person along with a parent (or at least a friend, in a public place).



- Never respond to uncomfortable or hurtful messages. Immediately stop the communication, shut down the computer, and inform your parents.
- Never reveal passwords, not even to a boyfriend, girlfriend, or best friend. This is important to prevent theft of money and identity theft. Contact 1930 for Emergency Financial Cyber Crime or 112 for all other cybercrime emergencies.
- Discuss cyberbullying: Never share something online that can hurt someone, not even as a joke, because lots of people will read it, and they may pass it on to more people. Do not gossip, spread rumors, or damage someone's reputation online.

☑ Discuss sexting:


- A girl may sext as a way of flirting, a joke, to become popular, or to be seen as cool. The delighted and excited boy may share his girlfriend's photo with his two best male friends—and one of them may post it online.
- A boy may take revenge on his ex-girlfriend by posting an intimate image, video, or text. Remember that 99% of adolescent love affairs do not last.
- Virtual identities may be fake. Even the pictures may be of someone else.

☑ Use parental controls and filtering software:

- Basic digital controls on all smartphones tell you how much time was spent every day on each App site.
- Google Family App is free, and informs the parent of what Apps are loaded on his child's phone, and every new App he uploads, and can block any App, or restrict the use of an App to a given time.
- Paid Apps such as Net Nanny automatically block all pornographic, violent, dangerous, and filthy sites, and give the parent dictatorial powers over the child's online usage.

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Eye Problems in Children Post COVID-19 Pandemic Essential EYE CARE TIPS For Parents

midst a mixture of excitement and nervousness, millions of children in India returned to their schools after 2 years post the COVID-19 pandemic. Even though we have resumed our regular lifestyle and duties under utmost care and restrictions, an important factor that has been grossly overlooked by the parents is their children's eye health and examination.

The last couple of years have been really difficult

and challenging for parents and children alike with the restrictions in place due to the pandemic and visits to the doctors seemingly appearing difficult and unsafe. But as we still recover from the pandemic, an important part of this normality should also include normalising children's eye examination. The most encountered eye problems in children are refractive errors (like Myopia, Hypermetropia and Astigmatism), Amblyopia (lazy eye) and Strabismus (deviation of eye). While in Infants, redness and crusting of eyes, excessive tearing, extreme light sensitivity, eyes turning to one side, white spot or white pupil are alarming signs and require urgent visit to ophthalmologist.

With worsening of eye sight, myopia (ability to see only nearby objects and difficulty in seeing distant objects) and eye allergies on the rise and most reported eye problems in children under the age of 12 years, it is found that not many parents are keen to take their children for routine eye check-up. The negligence in taking the children for examination may lie in the hesitancy to let the child use spectacles or due to fear of visiting a doctor due to crowd and rush in hospitals and fear of infections.

Even though a large number of Indian population believe that their child's health is important to them, very few comply with taking their children for an eye check-up. As a result the number of children with myopia in India is on a sharp rise, particularly in cities amongst children who spend less time outside in sun and due to increased screen usage time to attend online classes. The reduced field activities and increased screen time, laptop, mobile and television



use just adds to the harmful effects on the eyes. Furthermore, excessive eye rubbing due to air pollution and poor lighting at home also adds to blurred vision. Children with poor vision have found to have poor academic performances due to inability to see the board in class.

When certain visual skills have not developed, or are underdeveloped, learning is difficult and stressful. A child may not tell you that he or she has vision problem because they may believe that this is the way





everyone sees. Children will typically attempt to do the work, but with a lowered level of comprehension or efficiency.

Signs that indicate a child has a vision problem include:

- Frequent eye rubbing or blinking
- Avoiding reading and other close activities
- Complaints of discomfort and fatigue
- Frequent headaches
- Holding reading material close to face
- Seeing double
- Short attention span
- Covering one eye
- Tilting the head to one side
- An eye turning in or out
- Difficulty remembering what he or she read
- Losing place when reading

Undetected and untreated, vision problems can elicit similar signs and symptoms usually attributed to attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). Due to these similarities, children eliciting these symptoms should have a comprehensive vision exam with their ophthalmologist to avoid misdiagnosis.

So why does the examination of eyes in school going children become so important? It is to ensure that their eyes are healthy and do not have any significant problem to interfere with their academics and performances. Early diagnosis of myopia may help in preventing the progression rapidly during the school years.

When and who should have their eyes examined? Earliest mandatory eye examination is recommended

when the child is six months old followed by another examination by 3 years of age. The next examination should be done before the kid enters the first grade and once more between the age of five to six years. If the child is found to have vision problems, glasses should be given with a check up annually. In otherwise healthy individuals, examination every other year is recommended.

Our suggestions and recommendations for parents would be-

- Catch the warning signs: Reading with one eye covered, reading with materials close to face, short attention spans, complaints of headache and eyeache, repeated and frequent mistakes in school notebooks, inability to read from last benches all may suggest that your child has vision problem and needs attention to it.
- Limit the use of digital devices: Long hours of using laptops, tablets, mobile phones and using them while lying down on bed may cause headache, burning sensation in eyes, watering. It is advisable that the use of such devices is limited to needful and study purposes under adequate lighting and device brightness adjustments. Auseful home remedy of 20-20-20, focusing on a point 20 feet apart after 20 minutes of screen use for 20 seconds may help relieve eye discomfort.
- Improve the diet: Giving your child green leafy vegetables, carrots and diet rich in proteins in a form of salad or juice or any form they like, provides beneficial effects to the child's eye overall.







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
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HOW TO LIVE TO A RIPE OLD AGE

1. A number of factors count towards the length of a person's life, genetics being the most important. - d. Take supplementary fiber such as Isapghol.
- e. Enjoy milk, cheese, Meat, Poultry, Eggs and Sea Food in moderation.
- f. Enjoy two full meals a day and no snacking in between meals.

3. Life style and activity:

- a. Sleep 6-8 hours at night.
- b. Do not smoke.
- c. If you don't drink do not start. If you do, take alcohol in moderation.
- d. Walk up and down the stairs.
- e. Don't drink and drive.
- f. Continue to be active physically, mentally, sexually and socially.

4. Social & Economic activity:

- a. Value family life and participate actively.
- b. Read books.
- c. Actively engage with younger people.
- d. Stay informed about current events.
- e. Be passionate about culture and sports.
- f. Value spirituality.
- g. Earn as much as you can to control your healthy environment.

5. Exercise:

- a. Walk at least 3 km every day.
- b. Swim if opportunity is available.
- c. Learn and practice yoga.
- d. Mitigate the loss of muscle due to ageing with protein rich diet and lifting heavy objects deliberately.
- e. Work on balance, especially standing on one foot.
- 6. Work:
- a. Do not retire.
- b. Work part-time or at volunteer jobs.
- c. Have productive and fulfilling reasons to get out of bed each morning.

7. Medical action:

- a. Take charge of your own health.
- b. Listen to your body.
- c. Maintain long term relationship with your primary care physician and certain specialists that fit your need.
- d. Promote good vision.
- e. Use hearing aids as needed to retain brain function.
- f. See a dentist every 6-12 months and practice good oral hygiene.
- g. Maintain up to date vaccination schedule.
- h. Sensibly maintain distance from people likely to be infectious and don't be shy of masking.
- i. Take as few medicines as possible and few diagnostic tests and surgical procedures as possible (especially back and knees).
- j. Utilize acupuncture and massage.
- k. Moisturize abundantly especially in winter.
- I. Use saline nasal spray often to prevent nose bleeds
- **8. Pain:** If you are older and don't hurt somewhere when you get up in the morning, you may already be dead.

Meeting concluded with vote of thanks to the Chair.


















HEALTH-CARE TRAINING New Initiative at MID SKILL ASSESSMENT OF NURSING ASSISTANTS

The Nabi Karim Centre commenced health care training for Nursing Assistants by collaborating with SSS Foundation. More than 25 young women have been enrolled and trained.

Apollo MediSkill conducted assessment of 48 students for award of certificate of General Duty Assistants at Rajdhani Charitable Eye and Medical Center Nabi Karim on 09th November 2022. 


